

They put more than just their money into the business: they also invest courage, creativity, confidence and commitment. This makes it all the more important for them to keep an eye not only on the opportunities, but also on the risks during the initial phase. If a person is to launch a successful business, he or she must be able to recognise dangers in good time and to develop effective counter-strategies. The Entrepreneurs Club Berlin’s “FailCon Berlin” offers a lot of ideas here: How can I identify problems in time? How can I cope with a crisis? Who will support me when times are hard? These and many other questions can be discussed at the event with experts in the field.

It is not possible to exclude every commercial risk in advance. This makes it all the more important to develop a “second chance culture”. Even if a first attempt at setting up a business goes wrong, it must be possible to have another shot. Other countries like the United States can serve as a model for us here. The German government is addressing this by reforming the insolvency rules, and will halve the waiting period for debt cancellation to three years so that

people can get back into business more quickly. This is also an important issue for the forthcoming FailCon Berlin.

Entrepreneurship continues to have a future: this is shown impressively by the German Entrepreneurship Week from 12 to 18 November 2012, with more than a thousand events. FailCon Berlin is making an important contribution towards this. I wish the organisers and all the participants every success.
